Student Advisory Committee (SAC)

District Advisory Board Recap by Erin McCain

- Reduction In Force (RIF) has been approved by the school board. This does not mean it is *definitely* happening. Right now, it looks like Irish will be able to hold all tenured teachers and 2 probationary. Irish expects to lose 5 positions because of reduced budget and lower enrollment.
- The group present combined feedback provided by each school regarding the last DAB meeting. Wants to shift the perspective on consolidations to what *gains* can be made rather than loses.
- Listening sessions: 3/5 at Bauder and 4/16 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. at Bamford and Rice. Board members will be present and the meetings are open to all community members. These meetings are not specifically addressing consolidation.

From Ms. Mozer:

- Lindsey shared with Brian Kingsley: District is championing enhancement and improvement through the consolidation process. If there were less access to dual language programs (the only program that is specific to the Hispanic community) the process would be viewed as disingenuous (at best) and possibly discriminatory.

Consolidation Timeline

- Mid-May – will be able to see the criteria being used to consolidate schools
- May-Oct – action teams amongst HR, transportation, safety to make decisions
- Oct 20 Board Meeting – the final plan will be presented for board approval. Afterwards, staff and operations arrangements will begin being made for the 2027-2028 school year.

Transition to new

- Ms. Mozer's retirement plans include coaching and consulting for a dual language program in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. She'll also provide music lessons for the preschool programs.
- The hiring process for Irish's new principal is underway. Interviews will be happening soon.

- 2 parents need to be on the interview panel. Email Clarissa Hernandez to express interest in helping.
- Hoping to have a new principal hired by the end of April.
